building and called it a "church". At the same time he managed to God was in fact scriptural and in some extreme cases implied that not to would be punishable by hellfire. The concept of requiring a building to worship in is nothing more than a custom that holds no credence in New Testament law. "And He said to them; full well ye reject the commandment of God, that ye may keep your own tradition". (Mark 7: 9, 13)

You cannot find in scripture where Jesus commanded men to build His church from stone and mortar. You can find the Spirit enlightening us to the truth that Jesus would build His church out of living stones. (1 Peter 2:4-9) And you can find Jesus, in Matthew 16:18, telling Peter and His disciples that the Church of God would be built on the Truth that Jesus was the Son of God. The only foundation or cornerstone I see being laid by Holy commandment is Jesus Christ.

So why did the modern church system conceive of the idea that multi-million dollar cathedrals, mega churches etc., were the norm? Jesus Himself, when asked by the Samaritan woman where men should worship, gave such a clear sound of the trumpet in *John 4: 19-24*; in effect declaring that man was forever free from the shackles of church building. He directed us instead to enter the "Holy of Holies" of our heart that lies within our personal church building, our body of living stone, where we ourselves are the "High Priest" and wherein liveth the Holy Ghost. *(1 Corinthians 3:16)*

Poor sensual man whose partiality for worshipping the things of the earth: stone, wood, gold (*Acts 17:29*) over the unseen things of the spirit created an avenue for the enemy of his soul to fashion a commercial system as great or greater then secular commercialism—"Churchianity".

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God gave man free will and majesty of choice; therefore, if you desire to continue pouring your cash into this bottomless pit, cum religious monster, you are free to do so. Nonetheless Jesus, through salvation has given you a better way, a way to Heaven, where there is no temple, church, mosque or synagogue. *"And I saw no temple therein: for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are the temple of it." (Revelations 21:22)* He has opened a way for His children to enjoy unrestricted worship of His spirit, which He promised us dwells in our hearts.

Always remember that fellowship is free, no building requirements, no big gathering required. Jesus said, *"Where two or three are gathered together in My Name, then there am I in the midst of them." (Matthew 18:20)* Jesus even supplied a spiritual pastor for those who truly desire deep spiritual fellowship and feeding—the Holy Ghost. John 14:26 and 15:26

If true spiritual worship can be obtained through the spirit in our hearts, then where lies the Saturday and Sunday law? These "conflicting" Sabbath laws have been fulfilled by two of the greatest laws ever given to man. "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul and with all thy mind. This is the first. The second is like unto it. Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself." (Matthew 22: 37-40) If you truly love God, then you don't need a law to tell you so. Your worship will come from your heart not from fear of Moses' rod.

You will see that God's wisdom will prevail over the traditions of man. As the world enters into the end of days, where open worship of Jesus will be forbidden, church buildings will be but a memory.
